M., Ho. Gilbert Haugen (chairman), presiding. There were present: Representatives Haugen (chairman), McLaughlin of Michigan, Voight, McLaughlin of Nebraska, Tincher, Williams, Sinclair, Clague, Clarke, Jacoway, Kincheloe, and Jones. The committee then proceeded to the consideration of H. R. 5823, which is here printed in full as follows: A Bill Providing the establishing shooting grounds for the public, for establishing game refuges and breeding grounds, for protecting migratory birds, and requiring a Federal license to hunt them. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That this act shall be known by the short title of the Federal public shooting ground and bird refuge act. Sec. 2. That no person shall at any time hunt, pursue, shoot, capture, kill, or attempt to hunt, pursue, shoot, capture, or kill any migratory bird included...
