These are illustrated by 1,518 full-sized photographic reproductions and line drawings distributed throughout the text. Taken as a whole, this Collection of Royal Scarabs, which, however, only forms one-fifth of the Scarab Collection in the British Museum, is the largest and most important in the world, and is invaluable to the student of Egyptian history, religion, and art. The interest of the Scarab is primarily religious and historical, and there is no evidence that it was ever used as currency, as some have supposed. The greater number of the Scarabs herein published have been acquired during recent years, and have not previously been edited. The descriptions given form the greatest mass of material for the study of...
