It yields: Metallic Iron, 42. 200 Metallic manganese, 3. 825 Phosphorus, 108 Silicious matter, 19. 830 Phosphorus in 100 parts iron, 255 Houston mines. Near Houston station, on the line of the Shenandoah Valley Railroad, the Crozer Steel..
