Dimensions: 9.7in. x 7.4in. x 0.2in.GAO was asked to evaluate both the medical procedures which were used to screen Indochinese refugees overseas and the followup procedures which were practiced in the United States to determine if those procedures were adequate for protecting the public health. GAO found that many refugees were detained in overseas camps because they did not meet medical eligibility requirements. These requirements were relaxed in 1980 and refugees were routinely granted medical waivers; however, they were to receive followup care by health departments once in the United States. The incidence of serious and contagious diseases in the refugee population, including tuberculosis, hepatitis B, malaria, and leprosy, greatly exceeds that found in the general U. S. population. Although the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) maintains that there is no public health problem, it has encouraged health departments to make special efforts to monitor refugees. State and local health departments have said that the refugees health problems could be controlled if there were adequate funding; but they have also stated that providing services to the refugees hindered services to the general population.
