The specimens come for the larger part from the Christian cemetery of Akhmim, upper Egypt, the ancient Panopolis of the Greeks, where in 1884 many burials of Roman and Byzantine times were opened, yielding an enormous number of garment and tapestry fragments and even entire garments. All range from the first or second to the eighth centuries of the Christian era. The Rev. Walter Lowrie some years ago read a paper before the Archaeological Institute of America on Greco Roman Textiles, in which he called attention to the enormous importance of these garments in their bearing upon the study of ecclesiastical vestments. At first they were rather neglected by scholars, being regarded by them as representing merely a provincial industrial art. But Mr. Lowrie was among the first to realize that they represent the cosmopolitan art and costume of the Roman Empire during this whole period. They have, therefore, the very greatest...



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
