

It seems to follow from the views developed by the author that epochs characterized by the simultaneous coexistence of very different climatic conditions over different regions would depend upon variations in the distribution of land and water, combined with obstructions ot the hydrothermal agency, whereby the surface of the earth receives heat from its interior. Geological observation seems to point out that such conditions would be most likely to arise during the later and prehistoric formations, as well as during the period of the physical history of the planet which now witnesses the development of our own race.
