




A Light Affliction: a History of Film Preservation and Restoration (Paperback)

In the 1930s, the first concerted attempts at film preservation were begun by pioneering individuals such as Iris Barry at New York s Museum of Modern Art; Ernest Lindgren at the British Film Institute, and the indomitable Henri Langlois at the Cinematheque francaise, a man who performed heroics in occupied France to save the world s cinematic heritage from destruction by the Nazis. The 1980s video boom encouraged the studios finally to instigate asset protection programmes and in the digital age new methods of producing, exhibiting and restoring motion pictures emerged.
