Whatever may have been the primitive art of the people of Etruria before the arrival of Demaratus with his colonisers from Corinth, in 664 B.C., it took from that time the Greek style of the archaic form then practised, and adopted the Greek subjects. How far the mythology is derivable from the Egyptian theogony is another question, too wide to be entered into here. The important point to bear in mind is the general archaic condition of sculpture prevailing at a time extending from the first Olympiad 776 B.C. to the middle of the sixth century B.C.; examples of which, all more or less resembling each...
