




Oxford Chilodren's Book of Great American Poems

This collection, edited by acclaimed children s author and poet Donald Hall, returns the forgotten treasures of American children s poetry. Featuring some of the best of children s book illustration-including archival selections from rare and early editions and pictures from now defunct 19th- and early-20th-century children s magazines-this anthology revives not only the classic poems but also the atmosphere of the periods in which they were written and read. Starting with anonymous Native American verses and a selection from the 1727 New England Primer, Alphabet, this book spans two centuries of American children s poetry. Immediately recognizable names, including Emily Dickinson, Robert Frost, Carl Sandburg, and T. S. Eliot are joined by talented contemporary poets like Gwendolyn Brooks, Sandra Cisneros, Janet S.
