


Norms of Gender Discourse and the Novels of Shashi Deshpande

Perpetual negotiation between the socio-cultural norms and individual urges establish her novels as a discourse of muted women s culture. Gender becomes an analytical tool to explain the making of her characters. Muted Group Theory propagated by Edwin Ardener/Sherley Ardener along with communication theories are used to develop framework of Muted Gender Discourse. Lexplains how women have been schooled to silence in the name of idealized female roles. Assertion of the Self deals with a self open to de-reconstruction. Theme of assertion has been taken up as a method of resistance, rejection and subversion of gender norms. The Struggle for Autonomy is based on relational autonomy by C MacKenzie & N Stoljar. Realization of autonomy by her later protagonists is through deep understanding of gendered socio-cultural structure.
